



RHS Credit Recovery Summer School 2022
Important information for grades 9-12

General Information

Summer School classes for Redlands High School students will be held **in person, for all students** at Redlands High School, 840 E. Citrus Ave., Redlands, CA 92374. Academic classes will be available to students who previously earned an F in the same course and conducted via Edgenuity, a web based curriculum.

The summer session is divided into two semesters. Each semester class offers 5 credits. Students may take a different 5-credit class during each of the semesters. If the student is taking a two-semester class, he/she will need to attend both semesters. Students who are taking only a one-semester class will need to determine which semester they will be attending. All courses must be completed by the end of second semester.

A breakfast will be available at no cost.

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Registration

Registration is completed through your counselor. Please make an appointment to see your counselor before school, at lunch, or after school to discuss recovering grades and attending summer school.

Summer School class lists will be available by June 6, 2022. Information will be emailed in June confirming enrollment.

Attendance

Attendance is extremely important in these condensed semesters. Students will be allowed to miss a maximum of six (6) hours per semester, regardless of the reason. A tardy constitutes a loss of one hour of attendance. Students accumulating more than six (6) hours of absences due to full period absences and/or tardies will be dropped from class.

Students are required to attend the first day of class or they will be dropped.

Any student who does not complete a course by July 28th will be required to retake the course, no exceptions.

Behavior

Behavioral expectations required during the traditional academic year remain in effect during summer school and students who do not meet those expectations will be dropped from the summer school program.

Academic Requirements

Competency-based classes in English, Math, Science and Social Studies are academically rigorous. Students enrolling in these classes should be prepared to devote a significant amount of time both in and out of class. Students are expected to attend tutorials if subject area competency is not achieved. All courses must be completed by the end of second semester. Incomplete courses will not carry over into the school year.
