SCHOLARSHIPS

1. Attention Seniors: Every year the Redlands Community Scholarship Foundation along with other donors provide over 100 scholarships, ranging from \$200 to \$7,000 to Redlands High School's graduating seniors. If you have satisfactory grades and have been involved in activities or community service while at Redlands High School, you are encouraged to apply. Seniors may begin the online application on January 18th. Application instructions and student specific login information will be distributed to all seniors through English classes prior to that date. One signed paper copy of your submitted electronic application is due to the Counseling Office by Friday, February 1st. **NO LATER THAN 3pm. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
2. **#34 The Hispanic Engineer National Achievement Awards Conference (HENAAC) Scholars Program** is a renewable scholarship of up to \$10,000 per year for Hispanic students pursuing a STEM-related degree. Eligible students must: Be of Hispanic origin and/or must significantly demonstrate leadership or service within the Hispanic community. Have an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher. Demonstrate merit through academic achievements, leadership, and campus/community activities. Be pursuing a science, technology, engineering, or math degree. Be enrolled in an accredited undergraduate or graduate program for the preceding fall semester at an accredited 2- or 4-year college/university in the United States or its territories. Application deadline: TBD (scholarship information to be released in February) What to expect when applying: Students will need to provide transcripts with cumulative GPA; a 700-word essay; current résumé; one peer letter of recommendation; one letter of recommendation from a faculty member, teacher, mentor, advisor, counselor, principal, or dean; and a photo (used for publication purposes only). 3. **#35 Try the Generation Google Scholarship.** This scholarship awards \$10,000 to high school seniors who are from an underrepresented group, including African Americans, Hispanics, American Indians, and Filipinos/Native Hawaiians/Pacific Islanders, and intend to study computer science. Eligible students must: Plan to be enrolled full time at a university in the United States or Canada for 2019–2020. Be pursuing a computer science or computer engineering degree (or something closely related). Exhibit high academic achievement. Be a student from an underrepresented group.
