GENERAL

- RUSD SUMMER SCHOOL:** If you have previously failed a course required for graduation, please make sure to sign up to attend RUSD Summer School, which will be held this summer at Redlands High School. Forms are available in the RHS Counseling office and must be returned to your counselor on or before April 19. Additionally, if you earned a "D" in a course that is a college pre-requisite, you may retake that course (this does not apply to some courses) this summer during RUSD Summer School. Please see your counselor for information regarding that program. Lastly, if you are interested in accelerating your math path, applications are available for the Bridge courses for Math IIIH and Math IIII.
- Prom Information:** If you are planning to attend the Prom, please be aware of the following things:
 - You must have your current RHS ID card to make a purchase AND to enter the dance. If you did not turn in the 2018-2019 dance agreement that was part of the summer mailer, you will not be able to purchase Prom tickets until that form is completed and returned to the Finance Office.
 - If you aren't sure, check the list with Ms. Perez in the South Campus Office. If you have lost yours, they are available in the Student Center.
 - All RHS Prom Tickets are non-refundable. We will not be able to give you your money back if you do not attend. Please make sure that you can go before you buy your ticket!
