### SCHOLARSHIPS

1. **#12 Francis Ouimet Scholarship Fund Award:** \$60,000 Deadline: December 1, 2019.  
How to Apply: Submit an application <https://www.ouimet.org/app/> Eligibility: High school seniors who have dedicated more than 2 years of service to particular golf services at any golf course in Massachusetts.

The Francis Ouimet Scholarship provides funds to students who have worked professionally in the golf industry, caddies included. As the largest private scholarship in New England, it promises up to \$60,000 for educational costs. To enter, students need to submit an application that details their academic achievements.

2. **#13 Burger King James W. McLamore Whopper Scholarship Award:** \$50,000 Deadline: December 15, 2019  
How to Apply: Submit an application <https://burgerking.scholarsapply.org/>  
Eligibility: High school seniors. Fans of the Whopper rejoice! Your favorite burger chain gives away scholarship money, too. The Burger King Scholars Program was created in memory of co-founder James W. McLamore in an effort to aid high school seniors and Burger King employees pursuing higher education. The minimum requirements to enter include a 3.3 GPA, 25 ACT, or 1220 SAT score, and active leadership in an extra curricular or community service role.
3. **#14 Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Competition Award:** (2) \$50,000, (2) \$40,000, (2) \$30,000, (14) \$20,000, (480) \$4,000 Deadline: November 5, 2019 How to Apply: Submit an application <https://ohioelks.com/scholarships> Eligibility: High school seniors The Elks National Foundation Most Valuable Student Competition is one of the largest scholarships available to students in the United States. Don't worry if you're not a first-place recipient scoring the grand \$50,000 award — there are a total of 500 chances to win a sizeable chunk of money! Since it's a merit-based scholarship, students need to prove their strong academic record, ability to lead, and commitment to service activities.
4. **#15 The Heisman High School Scholarship program** recognizes male and female community-minded scholar-athletes at the state and national level. 88 State Winners receive a \$500 scholarship. 10 National Finalists receive a \$1,000 scholarship. 2 National Winners receive a \$5,000 scholarship. National Winners and their parents will also be invited to attend the Heisman Trophy weekend in New York City where they will receive national honor and recognition during the televised ESPN Heisman Trophy ceremony. Winning a Heisman High School Scholarship requires a weighted GPA of 3.0 or better, participation in at least one school-sponsored sport, and demonstrated leadership at school and in the community. 5. **#16 The Edison Scholars Program** recognizes students who want to be makers of tomorrow — the dreamers, inventors, guardians and pioneers — those who dare to be great. Each year, Edison International awards \$40,000 college scholarships to 30 high school seniors to help them follow their dreams in science, technology, engineering or math (STEM) and empower them to change the world. This is a chance for students with big dreams to advance their education and take part in shaping a brighter future. Must be a high school senior with at least a cumulative 3.0 GPA, plan to pursue studies in the STEM fields at a four-year accredited college or university and show financial need. Eligible STEM majors include computer and information systems, engineering, engineering technology, management information systems, mathematics, natural resources and conservation and physical sciences. Applicants must live in Southern California Edison's service territory. The top 50 finalists will be required to submit a short video. Don't stress, it's simple. Dependents of Edison International and SCE employees and retirees are not eligible. The application period for the 2020 Edison Scholars is now open!
